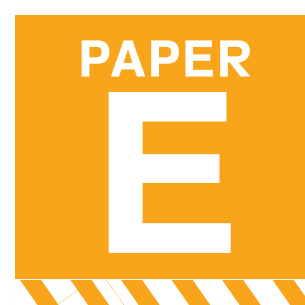
**Medium** about 50–70% of candidates will get the item correct
